Dear Families and Friends,

We end the week with the predicted bad weather, so I hope you all have warm activities planned over the weekend! The town council offices are host to the 'warm spaces' movie night after school. They are showing Paddington and giving free sweeties with hot chocolate. Enjoy.

This weekend it is Roscos birthday, and he is 3 years old. He is a much loved member of our school community, as well as Mrs Hall's home, and shares his birthday with Mrs Parry, who he spends a lot of time with. Mrs Parry is our 'Children & Family Support Worker'. She works as part of our wider Vulnerable Pupils' team, alongside Mrs Freeman, Miss Robinson, Mrs Moore and Mrs Cooper. If families need any assistance, whether this is uniform related, anxiety, behaviour, bereavement, home matters, school support or communication assistance, we always point people towards Mrs Parry. She can be contacted directly via her email, or through the school office. You can also simply call or catch her out and about too. Mrs Parry, Mrs Freeman and Miss Robinson host regular coffee mornings also. These sometimes have a focus on topics, such as special educational needs, medical support, positive parenting or frankly.....anything that might be of help. More often than not, this can be as simple as a chat about your child in school. Please do look out for these events on our diary dates.



I'd like to remind people about responsible parking near the school. It is not legal for pick ups and drop offs at school times to park down School Lane, and certainly never in front of our emergency access gates which have yellow cross hatching. The residents of School Lane do show immense patience with the volumes of traffic and parking, but also need to get their own cars in and out. Traffic wardens do patrol and last week, a number of families were issued with tickets. Equally, the school operates 'Flash Park' to ensure that only blue badge holders use our disability spaces, and that the staff working with children can use the spaces provided for employees. Key leadership staff do need to come in and out of the premises during the school day, sometimes for emergencies, and sometimes outside of school hours. Please be considerate to the safe needs of our working school. Thank you.

We have had an audit of behaviour and also inclusion in school recently. You may recall that we have been working as part of a DfE 'behaviour hub' to improve *hotspots* in our school. We have talked regularly with groups of children to obtain what we call 'pupil voice' as well as adults and families. The changes in the responses from the beginning of the year, to now, have been impactful. Mostly this has been around the use of playtimes. The changes we made included new equipment and zoning, as well as providing visibility jackets to the adults on safeguarding duty. The children do appreciate the increased visibility of the adults and the support of the older playleaders. Thank you to everyone who has supported us in developing these improvement over the past 12 months. Mrs Ross has plans to further continue this work, even though we graduate from the 'behaviour hub' very successfully. The pupil voice outcomes has given us ideas for more purposeful zoning, and the funding the school will receive as part of *graduation* will be solely used to continue the focus on happy playtimes.

Our Eco-Councillors have been thinking about the best way to raise the profile of sustainability. They have been focussing on this topic in their 'eco meetings' and have decided on a weekly cup winner class. They will be looking to ensure children are making good use of the recycling, picking up their litter, using the composting, turning off their lights and closing their doors. They even made the trophy cup out of recycled materials.



Our school improvement advisor visited on Thursday. The purpose of this visit was to complete a school review called an APD. Our school is firmly GREEN in all areas. This is thanks to the wonderful dedication of the staff team and the support of our families who help us so much. Thank you everyone.

I'd also like to thank you for the positive feedback you have given staff about the strike days. This is always a difficult decision for the staff. Being divided between ensuring a future better state funded system for all, and of course the needs of the families currently in our care. Your words do mean a lot to staff when they are juggling childcare for their own children attending different schools. Thank you for your support.

Our next big focus is to consider the new funding injection for PE and the impetus for ensuring equal access. Our current sports offer is very good, but as we move towards primary, we will be expanding our staffing and activities.
