Dear Families and Friends,



We began this week with lots of talk about fireworks and bonfires. We end this week with Remembrance. Our pupils have been painting pebbles to add to the memorial. Today, we have a few pupils who are attending the event at Samuel Whitbread, which is virtually shared across our classrooms as a special assembly. The children have rehearsed our school's poetry contribution to the readings, and they will be taking the 'unknown soldier' which was created by our youngest children in Cherry. This soldier comes back with the children, and we will then use it in our immersive room, so that the children from every class can experience laying their wreath, as well as seeing everyone else's. I look forward to meeting many of you on Sunday to walk to lay our



wreath. I hope to see all our other Shefford groups too.

When we remember the war, we think about conflict, and we follow this in schools with 'Anti-bullying' week. Anti-bullying is a key part of our behaviour approach, and our rules 'kind, safe, helpful' all year round. But this special week enables us to focus a lens more closely on the issues which define bullying as opposed to 'getting on and falling out'. We link our values teaching to 'Tolerance and Friendship' during this month to reinforce this. The theme this year is REACH OUT and Mrs Miller led a staff meeting for us last week to support the planning of activities in school aligned to this theme. You can find out more from the Anti-Bullying Alliance here. We will quite literally kick off the week by participating in the ODD SOCKS awareness campaign, to show that everyone is different.



We continue to strive for healthy lifestyles at Shefford Lower. This includes walking to school where possible. With the recent road closures, the options this week have been more limited, and we hope that your journeys become less fraught now that Ampthill Road has reopened. Please endeavour to use park and stride options, such as Morrisons. As the children take on their 'bikeability' in school, they are allowed to bring a bike with permission from our policy completed, and must wear a helmet. All bikes and scooters should be dismounted at Bloomfield Drive, or School Lane, and not ridden up the path, for the safety of others.



Very proud of our year one children this week! They went on their first school trip everrrrrr, to Shuttleworth. This ties in with their history of transport learning. The children were also exposed to a different museum and able to compare our own, which includes an old 'chopper' bike. When the children came back to school, the impact of such an experience is always really clear in the work in books, the excitement and the quality of discussions about history afterwards. The highlight was a ride on the old green bus and actually seeing a penny farthing bike that they had seen in pictures at school.

We also remind children daily that snacks sent in should be a piece of fresh fruit or vegetables, separate from their lunch boxes. This is not only kinder to 'teeth & tums' but also helps to reduce unnecessary litter on our school site. Thank you for supporting us with this at home. Also with teeth in mind, we avoid sugary drinks, and our policy is very clear about drinking water throughout the learning time. Children can have alternative drinks in lunchboxes, but not fizzy drinks. We are always a 'no nut' school.

Advent will soon be upon us, and the children are already beginning to mention the C word. We do allow children to write cards, and our pupil leaders empty the post boxes—so please name & class clearly on envelopes.

Teachers are planning and practising shows for you all to come and see. With 'The Wriggly Nativity' in early years, we move to a 'Christmas Show' for year one. Our children in year two are compiling a 'Christmas Bonanza' as well. No children will be asked to bring in costumes, as it is recognised the cost of living and stress of organising at this busy time is a difficulty, and we have costumes and festivewear. Year 3 have a montage of showcases to retell the story; year 4 bring together their learning and festive songs for you in their Christmas Carol Cracker. A big thank you from me for all of the staff that put these together. It is a lot of work behind the scenes and really adds sparkle and joy to everyone who watches.

We have parties, dinners and Shefford Jumper Day—no donation. Mrs Parry and Mrs Freeman are pulling together a toy give away in the learning hub on the 18th. They are also collecting Christmas Jumpers you may no longer need, as part of this. It's a great idea and importantly, it's also very eco-friendly. Thank you to the team for supporting this, and please come along.

Our PSA are busying away with present day and all that this entails. They begin very early on by organising your Christmas cards as soon as we come back in September. They need new members, and have had some join at the last meeting, which is very encouraging. Thank you to all that they do, their work is invaluable.




