Dear Families and Friends,

The beginning was launched with 'Anti-bullying' and thank you for sending children in wearing odd socks. This supported discussions in class around this month's values of Tolerance & Friendship. The children have

been taught to differentiate between *bullying* and *falling out*. In schools, children often fall out, and find friendships tricky as they negotiate a complex social situation with immature interpersonal skills. As they develop, they learn the language of values and begin to problem solve more successfully, but still need adult support on occasions to manage feelings and work

through solutions. Bullying on the other hand, is more targeted and protracted, and is not tolerated. Children are therefore taught what they can do to prevent bullying and who can help them solve issues before this happens. At Shefford Lower, we hold the view "it could happen here" and it is how we address it, with speed and agility that matters most. We regularly take in pupil voice (their view) and know that our pupils feel safe and secure. We also encourage families to be in communication with us, so please do always reach out—the

theme of the national campaign this year—as we are only too happy to support.

This week, we held a governors morning. This is when our governors come into school as a group and are given a variety of presentations and information. At the time of writing, they have spent time in our lunch hall and enjoyed their meals with the children. We have talked about how we hold progress and attainment information, how we support 'The Shefford Connected Curriculum' through our FLOURISH approach, and of course key areas such as Maths, English, SEND, Safeguarding and pupil premium strategies. All of this information is readily available on our website, and we also post it to our Facebook on a rota'd schedule to encourage as many views as possible.

We were delighted this week with the updated OFSTED dashboard. Our school is performing in the top quintile on every measure. This was not a surprise to us, as a lot of hard work and a continuous drive for improvement is always how we progress. We have shared the OFSTED Parent View to you all, and hope that you will engage with that. It helps them when they come to visit us, and this is due soon too. We think your views are crucial.

One of our parents suggested we hold a toy give away. A HUGE thank you to our parent. Her suggestion was a roaring success and clearly benefited a number of our families this year. Thank you to everyone that donated. What a super bunch the community of Shefford Lower are. Thank you.

This week I have seen lots of pupils with HT awards, and it is wonderful to have them come to me for their 'friendship making' skills which has been evident at playtimes too. Our children get to 'stand on the bench' in celebration assembly when they achieve this, and they also put 5 house points on each for their teams. I was especially pleased to see the progress of some of our y4 children, and join our teachers in the phone calls home this week, for Ethan, Louis, Ruben and Cassian. Well done boys.

We are now practising our Christmas songs. I know! We can't wait to showcase these to you over the December month. Today the children are finishing with Pudsey and it is our annual indicator that twinkle times are upon us. The PSA have wrapped gifts and the Fayre is the buzz. Anti Bullying Week 14th -18th November 2022

We had some excellent work taking place in school during Anti-Bullying Week. We wore odd socks on Monday, which led a discussion on how we are all different and unique. Children took part in Anti-Bullying themed lessons and activities throughout the week, learning about friendship, conflict and bullying.

We explored the theme of 'Reach Out' and who can help us if we are sad or upset. Children were encouraged to demonstrate friendly and kind behaviour in a range of ways, such as by sharing a smile, sitting next to someone new at lunchtime or helping a classmate with their work.

We had many different activities taking place across school. In Early Years, children listened to stories and learned about friendship, kindness and sharing. They made bracelets and paper chains with their friends. In KS1, children used role play to explore what it means to be a good friend and discussed different ways to be kind. They also learned the sign 'help' using British Sign Language. In KS2, children thought about those that are in need and created posters to show what they could do to help someone.

You can continue this learning at home if you wish by asking your child to talk about what they have learned this week. 


PSA News







