Dear Families & Friends,

It's already moving fast through January and we are well into our Spring units of work. We have been sharing different subject areas over our social media, but these are always available for you to view on our website

This term we have further invested in 'Numbots' for our younger children. We know how much many of our children love accessing the TT Rockstars, so this is to support the earlier skills through gamification. A letter is being sent home for you to support with accessing this.

Our main focus for home learning is always the reading. Reading aloud daily has such a positive effect on neural development and helps children in every other curriculum area, as they increase their vocabulary and narrative skills, in a way spoken language simply doesn't reach. We reward children each and every day for their daily read and this goes towards the weekly house point total in our celebration assembly. We do like to work in partnership with families and are only to happy to share ways to make reading fun and enjoyable.

Teacher strikes have been in the news this week. The NEU ballot has come out in favour of striking, and for our area these are planning for 1st February and 2nd March. Shefford Lower School will endeavour to remain open and able to offer educational provision for our children. We are asking teachers to be open with us about their intention to strike, although this is not something they have o disclose. We have therefore considered that we may need additional planning in place should other adults need to lead a classroom on those days. School leadership meetings with external providers, and families will be cleared, so that all available staff are ready to ensure we can make the best possible provision for our children.

Our curriculum has been scrutinised in recent weeks by our SIA (School Improvement Advisor). This week he spent a day in school looking specifically at writing. A strength of the school is the excellent vocabulary and narrative skills our children present with. If you have been with us a while, you will know that the connectivity and richness of our wider curriculum has always been our aim, and it is wonderful to see how much this is coming through in the work demonstrated by the children.

We use every opportunity to enrich our curriculum, and this week our PSA met and have agreed to look at funding another WOW day in school. Our children really enjoyed last year's events with the Bird of Prey centre and Safari Stu. This lead to lots of concepts and knowledge being learned, lots of fun and the writing that followed was fantastic.

Year two have their trip to St Albans, with the materials trail, to enjoy next week. This unit of work, learning about the *properties* of materials is linked to so many aspects of later learning, for example, electricity in year 4.

Our library Llama has had babies. WE learned that these are called CRIAS. Children using our library well can earn a cria to visit their classroom. Mrs Dale-Molloy has been fantastic about finding ways to make reading more fun and sharing books in the library is certainly a big factor.

Rated material may be targeted at stress and tension levels that are developmentally inappropriate, may expose children to images or themes that are harmful and disturbing, or can be accompanied by targeted advertising for older age groups.
