Dear Families and Friends,

A 4 day week for the children, but a very potent 4 was had in school! We began before, with training in all areas of additional need for our staff, sharing expertise and research, as well as some external training from the virtual school about emotion coaching. This is all part of our assurance that children are in safe hands at Shefford Lower, with staff who know their needs physically, cognitively and of course mentally. This is especially important to keep this ongoing focus post-pandemic.

The first day back saw Miss Hass lead a trip to the Fitzwilliam in Cambridge. You may already know that we have forged a partnership with the museum group, in order to develop our own museum and art gallery in a purposeful way. The main purpose is that all children are exposed to the



cultural capital they need in life, but also to link their knowledge to our wider curriculum and expand their knowledge of careers and skills they may not ordinarily have heard of or aspire to. The Fitzwilliam are working with us to create a 'Curator Award' so that when children leave us, they can have achieved this. Therefore, the children with expressed interests in History in year 4, with some from year 3, visited to meet an actual curator, and also a conservator. Their awe and wonder at the building itself was worth the visit, and we have learned so much to bring back to our own museum and involve the children, and we have a book based project about



early reading to do with the museum now too. We took a walk in the afternoon to the Sedgewick and learned about Darwin. Whilst there, we were shown and handled fossils of an iguanodon found in Potton and surrounding areas near to where we live. The children were fascinated. They learned that the collections of rocks and shells hold information for the future of climate change too. We have so much to share with our eco councillors.

The school had a local authority monitoring visit this week. A deep dive into some of our curriculum areas helped us to sharpen our laser focus on developing the improvements we have identified. So many good things were said, and directly about the areas we have worked so hard on. I'm always proud to show off our wonderful school, and the children did us proud too. They have become so articulate about their learning. We know that you asking children to discuss and explain things at home helps them to secure their information and help them to be ready for their next step. Thank you for your continued efforts and interest. We are always on a journey to continuously improve. This is the way we ensure we get the provision right for your family. We invite you to talk to us and send in your suggestions always, and I am outside as frequently as possible, as are many of our staff. Please do stop and chat, if only to give Tidy Ted a high five.

I remind everyone politely of a few bits and bobs—please name your child's hats, gloves, scarves and coats. Name EVERYTHING please, and if you have already named it....it's worth a quick look to see if it's still visible after a few washes. Please do NOT send your child with a rucksack. Our uniform states a draw string bag for PE so that it stores safely on the peg, and a flat book bag so that it stores in the trays children have. Thank you.

Children must not bring in items containing nuts, and I have been asked to remind families that this includes Nutella type products.

I have also been made aware that adults riding scooters are posing safety issues on the way to and from the school site. We do report this in, so please do be mindful to ensure the safety of all of our school users. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

This weekend, we will be enjoying the delights of fireworks in many areas. We hope you have lots of safe and courteous fun, and look forward to hearing how the children describe them when we see them again on Monday.

Tigers is tailored for youths from 12ish years up to 18 years.


Our new Jumpers For Goalposts group enables young adults to continue playing.
