Dear Families and Friends,

We were delighted with the feedback from our recent year 3 trip to Celtic Harmony. This is always an enjoyable trip and so nice to be able to go out of school post-pandemic again. These are the experiences our children need and benefit so hugely from. The organisers were impressed with the knowledge and behaviour of our children.



Our 'Healthy Me Day' on Monday happens every year, and this year the children had yoga sessions as well as the smoothie bike as special activities. We talked also about sleep hygiene. We are aware that gaming is highly addictive and raising children's awareness about having a range of enjoyable activities, is part of our life learning to.



I have had some impressive learning logs come to me this week and more importantly, the children have explained how they made the items and what they found out. The collaboration of families enhancing our curriculum this way, and children being able to share different information when they come into school is so good. Thank you from us to you.

We are working through the pupil assessments that we do at the end of each half term next week, so that the following week our consultation meetings with families can share this information. We also share the attendance figures for your child, as we know the correlation between attendance in the early years, and outcomes at GCSE is highly linked. Our family support worker, Julia Parry, is always keep to help families. Please do stop her when she is outside greeting families, or you can phone or email. No query or concern is too small.

Year two have their cake sale next, raising money for WWF. This is how Shefford Lower Support charities. We have significant requests from numerous charities to support them, so each year group takes their turn to vote on the charity they wish to support from their cake sale.

Our PSA met on Wednesday. They appointed a new chair during this meeting. This was not an easy appointment because the committee numbers have been impacted by the years of virtual meetings and events during the pandemic, rather than face to face. Please do offer your support to the committee if you are able to do so. Their role in school is so very crucial to the experiences of the children at Shefford Lower. Thank you very much to the wonderful committee that have been keeping us going, and of course to the outgoing chair—Hannah Hubbard—and vice chair—Claire Redman—for your dedication.

We have met with local authority representatives this week about the 'Schools for the Future' project, which sees Shefford Lower School becoming a primary school. The local authority is currently in the stage of assessing which feasibility studies should be undertaken, and the plan for Shefford Lower hasn't altered. The 'Parent Focus Group' looked at the project plan and began the task of overseeing policy changes, beginning with the mobile phone policy. These then go to the Board of Governors, as we aim to be ahead of our road map to change. As always, I am out most mornings, and happy to answer questions. I can't promise I have all of the answers in these early stages, but do feel free to stop and chat.




