What have we been up to?

In Nursery we have been continuing to encourage children with their independence skills, e.g. putting on and doing up coats and have been thinking about and exploring seasonal changes, including learning a new poem, 'Falling leaves'. We have also been exploring books linked to Black History Month. In Reception we have been investigating repeating patterns and patterns in the environment. The children have been creating patterns with natural objects as well as resources found in the classroom. We have learned about Harvest and sung Dingle Dangle Scarecrow. We have been celebrating and honouring the history, traditions, arts and culture of Black people during Black History Month and all thoroughly enjoyed making and consuming banana pudding! We have been continuing to learn about numbers and the different ways they can be represented and have built up knowledge of an impressive number of letter sounds.

Year 1 have had a brilliant first term and are ready for Autumn 2. Some classes have started Forest school which is exciting. Just a gentle reminder that Sycamore class will be going to Chicksands Woods on Thursday mornings, so will need a change of clothes for this. We are really excited for our Shuttleworth trip. This gives the children a brilliant insight into forms of transport, which is what we have been learning about. It is going to be a busy term with the lead up to Christmas, so the children will be learning various Christmas songs ready for their performance in December. Thank you for supporting your children with reading at home. We have had lots of positive responses regarding the Monster phonics books and the children love that they link with their phonic sessions. The Year 1 Team.

Year 2 have enjoyed their first half-term and have returned from half term ready to focus on our new local history unit for Shefford. If you have any family history linked to Shefford that you would like to share with us, we would really appreciate it. We have a very busy 8-week half-term in the run up to Christmas. With lots of fun activities planned as we begin to start our Christmas performance rehearsals. We are also requesting odd socks and gloves as we are creating puppets for out DT unit this term too. We made an amazing £139 that has gone towards our shoe box appeal. 
Year 3 have had another busy month - October has been filled with exciting learning about Mary Anning and her jaw-dropping discovery of the first ichthyosaur fossil, as well as creating our own stone age tool in D&T. They have understood the significance of Skara Brae and how it would feel to live in a cave in Pre-Historic times! The children have been learning how to use column method to add and subtract and it's been great to hear they have been testing parents and carers at home with this too! It is a tricky concept to understand but we have been so proud of how quickly they have developed their knowledge of it. In English, the children have been studying conjunctions and their role in sentence structure, as well as incorporating these into their own stories. It's been wonderful to catch up with all of you at parent's evenings and share the successes your children have achieved this half term and talk about how well they have settled. We hope the areas of development we have provided are useful and will help us to work together to support the children with their next steps. Thank you for all your Harvest donations and sweet treats for the PSA on Mufti day. We look forward to another jam-packed half term and all of the excitement and sparkle of Christmas!

Year 4 have really enjoyed their Forest School learning so far this term. They have had fun creating, investigating and learning new skills in a natural setting and have also had good opportunities to extend their classroom learning within the woods too. In Science, the Year 4s have been investigating changes in state and have enjoyed combining Art and Science to create their own Watercolour Water Cycle diagrams. The children have been writing for different purposes in English and have enjoyed writing in character as a Roman slave as well as persuading the Roman Emperor to let them join the Roman army in a persuasive letter. Our Geography learning has taken the children around the continents observing the expansion of the Roman Empire and seeing the other countries involved in the Roman invasion. They have further built on their knowledge of place value, including learning how to read and write Roman Numerals and have continued to add and subtract using written methods. The Year 4s have also enjoyed researching Roman mosaics and then designing and creating their own.
