Dear Family and Friends,

With a 4 day week to come back to, we packed in a LOT! Thank you for all taking part in our RED WHITE & BLUE day for the Queen's platinum jubilee. We enjoyed our jubilee activities and our whole school picnic. It's been a long time coming to be able to reinstate lots of whole school fun things. The atmosphere in school was wonderful. The unity such activities bring about is felt in all classes. We hoped you had fun talking about it afterwards at home.

Thursday was commonwealth day for us. We learned about different areas of the commonwealth in each of our classes and this was tied into our learning about geography. The children are creating displays for the school corridors based on what they have found out, and if you are coming to the Arts event, you will see these as you browse our art gallery too. Do talk to the children about what they have learned, and how they used globes, atlases and maps in their explorations. We also tied this in with World Ocean Day, as our 'Connected Curriculum' is designed to make links between subjects, and we have been thinking about the environment with our eco-council too. We will be sharing our learning with our twin school in Sri Lanka when they return. We would like to make other school links, so please do see Mrs Carter if you have a connection we can use.

Our children have completed SATs, with maths being the final paper. We have also returned to the Phonics Screening Test, which year 1 have to complete in June each year. Over the break we posted lots of resources to our <u>Facebook page</u> and hope they were useful to families in our early years classes too, who will be doing this next.

School attendance is key to school success, and head teachers are not allowed to grant term time holidays. The exceptional circumstances that apply are extremely strict and detailed in <u>our policy</u>. The DfE are very clear that the 13 weeks children have is sufficient, and have been clear about the amount of missed school for children already.

We are celebrating PE again...We returned to attend a cricket tournament this week too! Out of over 50 schools, we came 3rd, and the children behaved incredibly well. We always hear this about our children when they are out and about on school visits. The values we instil, and continually reinforce are shared at home and we thank you for your support in this.

Suncream, sun hats and rain macs! We have had EVERY season this week. Please make sure all of your child's things are named, and that they are well prepared for the sunshine as well as the rain. We go out in all weathers wherever possible. In Summer we always end up with more lost property on the field. So please do just check names haven't worn out in the washing machine, and that hats, bottles, suncreams, coats, cardigans and jumpers are fully visibly named.

Our children wanted equipment on the field. As well as our sensory trail and outside classroom, our lovely PSA met with captains who then chose items to buy. They chose traverse poles, a beanbag wall and some activity tables. These were then voted in by the PSA committee. Thank you for the support you give the PSA. They are funding friendship benches in their next move, as our values ambassadors have asked for these too. This came from talking to children about our work with the 'Behaviour Hub' and thinking about 'emotional health'. They have also been planting, decorating and painting in our outside areas—you may have noticed as you pass.

Our PSA also fund our leavers disco and a leavers book for every child in the three classes moving on. The next event the PSA are attending is the town fete of July 16th, and they do want a couple of helpers to support the stall. Please get in touch.

We continue to take in food for the NEED project, and to keep a 2nd hand uniform collection. Again, our PSA manage the uniform, and this ensures families have cost effective support for uniform. You may either need those extra clothes, or perhaps your child has grown, but you don't want to buy new before September. Please send your items in as you clear out.

The library will soon be releasing its Summer Reading challenge. We obviously love this, because it is all about the reading, which is crucial to learning. We will also be putting together reading ideas. In the meantime, we give out those daily housepoints for a read with a grown up each night. Please ensure the diary is signed, so that your child can collect points for their team.
