Dear Families and Friends,

We are very aware of the current situation schools find themselves in with the outbreak of Covid-19. At Shefford Lower School we have a prevention plan in action, and we are following all advice daily. We remain open, as it is the current scientific guidance for schools. However, we have a number of measures in school. You may already have noticed the increased installations of hand gel dispensers and our requests to ensure children have their very own named bottles. We have increased hygiene generally, and have made alterations to things like assemblies , carpet time and shared resources in classes.

We request families keep us informed if they have travelled, or have been in contact with someone who has the virus. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring we can maintain a strong learning environment. In the event of a school closure, our children have logins to Purple Mash, TT Rockstars, My Maths and Discovery Education. They also have topic learning they can add to in their Learning Logs, as well as daily reading. We have redistributed their logins again, and wish to reassure families that we are endeavouring to provide the best service we can in the current climate.

In other news, you may already have been made aware that the Local Authority are proposing radical changes to their schools for the future plan in Shefford. We were invited to a meeting just over a week ago where this proposal was shared with us. At this stage, it is only a proposal, and there was no consultation with Shefford governors and senior leaders. We have a meeting scheduled later in the month to express our views and understanding before this is secured into a plan that goes out to consultation. We urge parents to view the plan on the local authority site and share their views too.

I am absolutely delighted that the cross hatched yellow lines have been repainted outside our school entrance. There are also double yellow lines there, as this is the emergency exit for staff, and access for emergency vehicles to the back of the field. Additionally, you will have noticed the repainting of the School Lane restriction. There is no stopping in School Lane between 8.00am and 9:30am. Therefore, unless you have access to our staff car park, or live in one of the houses, there is no need to drive into School Lane. This is regularly patrolled.

Our teams in school have decided they would like to support Autism Bedfordshire with their 'Silly Sock Day'. We have a number of children in mainstream schools with this condition or related conditions and raising awareness, understanding and knowledge is a key aspect of our Values and Life Learning curriculum too. This will take place on 2nd April at Shefford Lower and we hope it will be both fun, informative and help to raise funds through donations for this worthwhile charity.

Values


The values from February 24th—March 13th are **Courage** and **Determination**.

Recorder players are beginning to prepare for their music medal assessments. Music Medals are teacher-led assessments for younger learners. They build on what's already taught in group lessons and enable students to gain recognition for their hard work. Assessments take place in school. There are five progressive levels. Copper and Bronze are stepping stones to Grade 1. Silver, Gold and Platinum reward further progress. Over the next few weeks children will be bringing home a letter with all the relevant details. It would help all children if they are encouraged to do a few minutes practice at home, several times a week.



When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis


Where disability means it is difficult for the family to organise care at another time.
