Dear Families and Friends,

I am incredibly thrilled to be able to share with you this week's successes. I am sure you will all join me in congratulating the staff when you read the following:

You may have noticed we had a number of visitors in school, particularly if you came through the 'Bloomfield' entrance where we greeted you. These visitors were Local Authority School Improvement Professionals, and they were carrying out a two day audit of the school.

The experience was a huge undertaking, and left no part of our provision unturned. They visited classes, looked at work, talked to leaders, middle leaders and a variety of staff across the school. They even sat and had lunch with the children and met our newly elected school parliament.

The feedback from the improvement team was so positive, and we are now beginning the year ahead with a secure foundation for further developments.

The leadership team and staff were particularly proud of the children during the visit, and their conduct was given specific praise, in terms of the respect the children showed for adults, for each other and when building relationships. Our staff were praised for their enthusiasm, and their ambition for 'big ideas'. Our auditors told us that our middle leaders were articulate about research and they 'know their onions'.

Of particular note, was our Early Years team, under Mrs Freeman's leadership. Our auditors described this as a 'flagship' provision. We couldn't be happier.

Going forwards, our thrust for reading and developing the curriculum is part of our plan, and our focus on writing and learner groups is targeted. We are developing our action plans for each subject to take into account the pace of learning and to maximise the opportunities for fullest impact. Our focus on vulnerable learners and identifying barriers is part of our deeper assessment and features in our future development plan.

This week, we have also held meeting with our neighbouring school, Robert Bloomfield. Mr Farmer, the head teacher, visited Shefford Lower and we discussed the opportunities our proximity enables us, so that we might provide greater continuity and fuller opportunities. Our shared aim is to focus on the needs of the children and to exploit opportunities that enhance both their academic skills and their life learning opportunities. We are beginning with a focus on reading, and look forward to seeing our alumni pupils inspire our current pupils.

For now, please forward your 'Extreme Reading' photos to Mrs Metcalfe, for her display. We have been thrilled with the number of children earning their daily house point for reading every night. Great team approach! We will be opening our book share on Monday, so please use this if you see it, and bring unused books to swap. You could also become a book sprite by using the flyer in this newsletter. We hope many more of you will join in.

A note on uniform. We take on board edits with regards to trousers being black or grey. The clarity for PE shoes is trainers and finally, Cherry Class have a slightly different dress code for nursery which is shared via the early years team.

As we break for the weekend, please know that we have held elections, and votes have been counted.....but it is a well kept secret who our house leadership team will be. Our captains, vice captains, prefects and ambassadors will find out during our celebration assembly on Monday. It's very exciting.
