Dear Parents & Carers,

I've had the pleasure this week of being outside at lunchtimes quite a bit this week. This is always wonderful for head teachers, because we can see who the children play with and how they play. It is clear that our children deliver on the values we teach and that adults act quickly when children find play difficult. We are always appreciative of your communications in this regard as well. As much as we encourage children to talk to us in the moment, we know they often recall and open up once they are home too. Thank you for your support.



This week we have opened our new sensory trail in our small wooded area. This includes an outside classroom and a pow wow seating area. The trail circles the seating area with mirrors, instruments, feely paths and other sensory items. This was brought about by using two grants to support outside learning and we have already used this for a targeted club and targeted support in school.



This week, volunteers came to school for training. We are thrilled that we have a group of willing volunteers able to commit time, and prepared to undergo the enhanced DBS checks required to help in class. We use our volunteers for a range of support, including reading. Volunteers might also be asked to support on trips due to their training and checks and as they come to know the class and teachers, to support with other aspects of learning. Thank you again for your interest and dedication to our school.

Another way to get involved, or support, is to join the wonderful PSA. It is with their support we have been able to add to our sensory trail, or consider saving for a dinosaur exhibit. Children in our school all experience the immersive room and this was a previous project paid for by the PSA. Coming up on Friday is the PSA mufti day, one of their many fundraising events. All funds go back into school to support your children. We do ask that the rules around merchandising are adhered to, and ensuring appropriate footwear and clothing for play etc is still considered on a mufti day.

Our unnamed lost property is becoming full! Please, please write names on everything. A sharpie pen will do the job for most items. We can't stress this enough, and know that families can ill afford to lose repeated items of clothing. Thank you for your support.

Thank you also to families who have replaced rucksacks with long handled or draw string bags. Our cloakrooms are much safe places, and Tidy Ted is finding it very difficult to choose which cloakroom is the winner each day!

With rising numbers of Covid positive cases within our school community and the surrounding area, we are taking a cautious approach to Christmas shows. We are switching from larger key stage performances, to year group shows that the children can practise in their classes. We have decided that we will re-evaluate after half term whether we can invite parents into one hall. If we did decide on this, we would need consider additional measures such as providing one child/one parent places, insisting on masks and ensuring one way enter/egress of the hall for social distancing. We may yet decide that the children perform their shows to the rest of the school rather than to an outside audience, or we may look at outside options. Whilst I know these measures might be disappointing, we clearly do need to consider the safety of all of our community, and we thank you for your understanding. We would also be keen to hear your contributions, so please do feel free to email me via the school office.

Parents consultations are next week, and we have a number of families that have opted for virtual meetings, and we respect this request. You will by now have been sent an option to make an appointment. We will be meeting you in year group rooms, and ask that you wear a mask when you arrive on site if you have a face to face appointment. Thank you.

We are set to have some autumnal sunshine this weekend.

Arriving to school on time

When pupils arrive late, they miss out on essential instructions given at the beginning of the lesson. This can significantly reduce achievement, regardless of academic ability. Your child may also feel awkward arriving to the classroom when everyone else is settled. Furthermore, when one pupil arrives late, it disrupts the entire class and the teacher—everyone's education is compromised.

5 minutes late every day = 3 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

10 minutes late every day = 6.5 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

15 minutes late every day = 10 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

20 minutes late every day = 13 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

30 minutes late every day = 19 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

Buster: The school has an obligation to ensure children are not exposed to material rated beyond their age, and log all concerns on *CPOMS. Rated material may be targeted at stress and tension levels that are developmentally inappropriate, may expose children to images or themes that are harmful and disturbing, or can be accompanied by targeted advertising for older age groups.


