Dear Families and Friends,

A huge thank you from all of us here and also from the 'Need Project'.



The Harvest collection of food was amazing. We were delighted that our collection was as wonderful as it usually is, and this was noted when it was collected too. It will all go to families in need of support. Our children were able to

watch a video presentation of Reverend Valentine, and our pupil leaders took our food to Reverend Ronnie to be blessed. We learned about the significance of Harvest, as part of the Bedfordshire Agreed Syllabus for RE. As always, we have been keen to be involved with our community and you may have seen our flag flying above the town hall. Our mayor, Paul Mackin, greeted our new pupil leaders with the flag we had made in school, and this was hoisted high to display our autumn branches with our values. It's been a rather busy week here. We had our first school trip too! At the moment this is our only trip planned. It was selected because it is mostly outside at Celtic Harmony and year 3 were able to travel in their bubble on coaches to the destination, where we were the only school on site. We were incredibly proud of our children, and very impressed with the staff there too. Many safety measures were in place and the children asked lots of meaningful questions as part of their learning.

In school, we have been thinking more about Christmas, and staff have been pooling together ideas too—our Eco Council are thinking about alternatives to cards as well. Our lunch staff are already coming up with ideas and we have also thought about music whilst we have restrictions around singing in groups. I can assure you that we will most definitely have special times in store.

Before this though, we have Remembrance. It is no coincidence that we begin this by moving our values focus on Monday to 'Tolerance & Friendship'. Our children will experience activities and focussed discussions about being a good friend and what it means to be different. This will move us into the month of November, and when the



curriculum brings us 'anti-bullying week'.

We were thrilled this week to have been donated some artwork for our school. Local Langford artist, Sally Quorn framed and sent us her artwork when she learned we were enquiring for our school. The children have been invited to ask questions about being an artist, and we know some of our children will be inspired to make their own creations.

Next week, we have PSA mufti day to look forward to, and this is an opportunity for the PSA to raise funds for the children. A polite reminder from me to be mindful of clothing that is merchandised around gaming for older children, such as Fortnite. Thank you.




Donations for Cherry

Walk the one way

The one way system prevents the risk of contamination from passers by, and also helps to maintain the

social distancing.

Keep the distance

Covid spreads less easily if people aren't close to each other. We have marked out lines to stay behind, and a safety box at the door to keep clear. Please stay outside of the box when talking to teachers.

One adult per drop off or collection

With 500 families, keeping numbers down will help to keep you safe, reduce the infection rate and help to keep our school empty. Please do not arrive on site in twos, or threes, or with friends.

Our staggered timings reduce the numbers of adults on site at any one time. We know they don't fit everyone, particularly if you have several drop-offs, so please talk to us if you have exceptional challenges. We have classes using different doors, and we also request adults move on after their designated time to help us keep congestion down. We are available by phone or email to answer queries and support you.
