Dear Families and Friends,

With the weather doing its thing, we are all crossing our fingers for our week of sports next week. Its been eventful in the news, with Roland Garros, and the start of the Euros. With England playing Scotland tonight, we reckon we have planned a super follow up.

As you know, we made this a bigger tournament, with the prediction that there would need to be compensating factors. With the restrictions still firmly in place, we sadly can't have parents in, but we know you will be cheering us on and encouraging the children to use their skills as well as their values. Our PE leader, Miss Leary, has been organising with our Sports Coach, Mr Tilbury. Children will be in house groups to compete a carousel of activities with a house winner of the day, and an overall house winner of the week. We encourage house coloured T-shirts and on this occasion children can arrive in their kits. We kick off with year one, and after year 4 take their turn on Thursday, our youngest pupils will have the Friday. In between this, teachers will be planning a range of sporting activities to make the week of sport truly eventful in each class, with our values ambassadors looking out for pupils showing patience, kindness, respect, tolerance, courage, generosity and excellence.

Transition day is the next thing on our mind. I chat with Mr Farmer at Robert Bloomfield about a number of things related to our two schools, and the close working relationship we have means that our children have as smooth a transition as possible. Whilst the shuffle up day is unlikely to go ahead, we will still see visits from RBA this side of Summer, and their dedicated year 5 day will go ahead in September as it did last year. Transition arrangements for vulnerable pupils are being arranged.

In our school, this means that we will be planning a carousel day for year 4, focussing on transition skills and learning. All other classes will transition to their new teachers as planned. We share classes with you just before shuffle up so that children can know where they are going, but not so far ahead, as our experience shows some children find this daunting.

We are fielding complaints regularly about parents who are not observing the one way system. We know people are fed up, but please help us. There isn't long to go until Summer. This path is part of Robert Bloomfield Academy, and as you know, they patrol this path and also talk to parents who do not follow the rules. Their health and safety advice is that this enables families to keep the 2 meter distance in front of them secure, and it is safest for our vulnerable families. Please do respect the difficult job school staff are doing to maintain safety. It is not uncorrelated that there have been a rise in local cases and absence this week, and we urge all our families to continue supporting the safety for the final few weeks.

The carpark is very busy, and we have insufficient spaces for the staff who come to work here daily. We also have 4 disabled places for the 12 eligible families that use our carpark. Unless you have a blue badge, you will not be given access to use the parking. Exceptional circumstances should be sent in writing to myself with supporting evidence. As we move to a primary, the parking at our site is one of the things we have raised to be part of the council priorities. We encourage you to also make your views known to the team dealing with 'Schools For The Future'.

The children learned lots during our 'World Oceans Day' and today Alfie proudly told me that 71% of the world is covered in water. So with that in mind, when Giovanni explained to me that we mustn't drop litter in the sea, we thought about the host of creatures that Imogen told me live there. A great day to think about climate change with the coinciding of the G7 Summit too. Well done children.

I have had a plethora of writing brought to me too this week. It's great to see the children understanding the process with first drafts and editing happening.

Have a great weekend, and enjoy cheering on your teams.


