Dear Families and Friends,

Our school, as I write, is full of red noses and head band boppers! It's red nose day as well as Science week fun. Each day working in a school brings something new, and it is such a privilege to work in such a vibrant environment. It was a soggy environment on Wednesday after the Woburn trip for year 1, but the children had an amazing time and learned so much too.

More recently, our school has been revitalised by the wonderful exhibits that are appearing in cabinets and on walls. Mr Bowen has been leading a team in school to develop an art gallery and museum. This isn't just any gallery and museum, because we have been working with the FitzWilliam in Cambridge and a museum school in Reading to ensure that the standard of display and choices meet the very strict standards that can become a community resource in the future. The work that has happened behind the scenes is beginning to take more shape in school. This week, after much work on cabinets, painting, lighting, locks and purchasing, the natural history cabinet is turning heads! The inspiration to uplift the experiences children have, and to



enable access for all regardless of family circumstance has impacted our curriculum and will continue to drive improvement of opportunity for pupils as we develop them as curators. A big thank you to our team.



The children have been working hard on their writing and art following hands on visits from animal and bird specialists. Our younger age groups met with Safari Stu, whilst our older children experienced the birds of prey demonstrations. Part of our Science, the experience of living animals also supports the PSHCE curriculum. More notably for us, we invest funding and time in forest school. We hope to earn the tree award for our school because of the progression in this area of learning. So, these experiences support that learning to remain memorable throughout their lives. We have the PSA to thank for this, and know that their

fundraising is always to support the enjoyment and excellence in the school. Please do join the PSA if you have any time to spare. Every little helps.....

A polite reminder from me about uniform. It is never easy to explain to children why they can't have the latest ruck sack, trainers or logo shirt in school. This is not made any easier when their friends arrive with these items, and parents have understandably asked us directly to address this. Our uniform is such that it is suitable for play, learning and safety, including sun safety when this comes about. The uniform also fosters a sense of belonging and reduces the 'haves' from the 'have nots'. If you have difficulty financially providing correct uniform, do please let us know. We treat this information confidentially and sensitively, and can assist you.

Thank you for continuing to ensure children dismount scooters and bikes as they arrive in school. It is also great to see so many using helmets on their scooters. The safety of children is paramount and there are so many encouraging helmet designs these days that children love.



Reading Sprites has restarted! We began this prior to lockdown, so that the children would be excited by books in a different way. The children may find a book that we have planted around the community, and their job is to enjoy the book and re-hide it afterwards. 

#### **RED NOSE DAY**


Thank you to everyone that managed to buy a red nose. We sold a total of 240 noses which raised £360.

Shefford Museum and Gallery is growing fast at Shefford Lower School. It features copies of some the most famous paintings in the world and authentic historical and natural history artefacts. We would like to share a different exhibit each week in the news letter. This week's featured exhibit is

More amazing items from our Shefford Museum antiquity department; these 5 ancient Egyptian Shabti amulets. A shabti (also known as shawabti or ushabti) is a generally mummiform figurine found in ancient Egyptian tombs, placed among a mummy's bandages to ensure the deceased a safe, healthy and productive afterlife. During the Predynastic (pre 3100BC) and Early Dynastic Period (3150-2686BC) there is some evidence of the sacrificial burial of servants with the deceased! However, this practice was quickly seen as unnecessary and wasteful, and instead symbolic images of servants were painted inside tombs to aid the deceased in the afterworld. This was then developed into the use of small statuettes known as Shabti.

Early versions (Shabti or Shabtiu) were modelled to represent the task that they would perform and given tiny tools with which to complete their tasks. Later on, Shawabti (and Ushabti) were inscribed with a magical formula which would activate them

They are commonly made of blue or green glazed Egyptian faience, but can also consist of stone, wood, clay, metal, and glass. These particular ones are made of faience and terracotta. In ancient Egypt, objects created with faience were considered magical.

The meaning of the Egyptian term is still debated, however one possible translation is 'answerer', as they were believed to answer their master's call to work in the afterlife.

### **PSA News**

Our next meeting is our AGM on Thursday 24th March @ 7.30pm and we need YOU!

This is a great opportunity to join the PSA as a new committee take the lead on discussing, planning and running lots of exciting events for all of the students at Shefford Lower School.

If you are keen to get involved then please contact the office.

All roles within the elected committee need filling as the current team step down after 2 years. No previous experience is necessary – the current Chair, Secretary and Treasurer all took on the roles in their first meeting at the AGM in 2020 and are willing to guide and assist anyone wishing to put themselves forward for these roles.

Please take a look at the descriptions below of what is entailed in each position and get in touch with the office to find out more about them.

#### PSA Chairperson (The Chair)

The Chair is the public face of the elected committee, representing the PSA where necessary at public events and meetings within the school. They are usually the 'nominated person' for the committee at the AGM and also the main liaison with the Head Teacher and staff at the school

- -Responsible for making interim decisions if necessary, that do not need the full committee. (All major decisions need to go to the full committee)
- -To understand the roles and legal obligations of the committee ensuring confidentiality requirements of the school and discussions within the PSA meetings are met
- -Responsible for ensuring al PSA members adhere to the school safe guarding policies
- -Takes charge of open meetings (AGM etc) and committee meetings. Ensuring meetings are effective, kept to time and the agenda fully covered. The chair has the casting vote of any decisions that need to be made at meetings
- -Must support and authorise the work of the secretary and treasurer
- -Receive a copy of all bank statements
- Authorised to create sub committees for events and smaller expenditure when/if necessary.

#### PSA Vice-Chair

- -The Vice Chair provides support to the chair and shares the workload if necessary
- -The Vice Chair should conduct meetings in the absence of The Chair
- -The Vice Chair may be called upon to assist The Chair with immediate decision making where a full PSA meeting may be inappropriate or too far away

#### PSA Treasurer

- -Maintain an overview of the PSA bank accounts
- -Report status of accounts at the meetings
- -Keep notes of incoming and outgoing expenditure
- -Arrange floats for events drop off at school if necessary
- -The ability to bank large amounts of money regularly
- -The ability to respond to emails regularly
- -To work with The Chair and school to make sure invoices are paid
- -Oversee administration of the Your School Lottery account

#### PSA Secretary

- -Discuss items for the next meeting with 'The Chair', ideally a week or two before the meeting.
- -Write the agenda and email the committee and school representatives separately (via Paula Hudson).
- -Attend every meeting and take the minutes
- -Write up the minutes and circulate round the committee and school representatives separately within a suitable time frame (1 week of meeting)
- -Keep a list of all member's details for correspondence
- Contact any parents who have shown an interest in joining the committee i.e. after a coffee morning or new parent evenings.
- -Save the agendas and minutes onto the PSA page of the school intranet (See Paula H in the office)
- -Keep PSA Noticeboard up to date
- -Keep school community updated through newsletter and social media.


