Dear Friends & Families,

We are very grateful to see the increases in wearing masks whilst dropping off and collecting. Thank you for your support with this. It is clear we have been very fortunate so far in school, and we have not had to close any class or year group bubbles, unlike other local schools. We remain vigilant of course. One of the clearest pinch points is the alley from Bloomfield Drive, and we urge you to leave 2 meters here, and also dismount bikes and scooters on this path as always. Thank you

I have been delighted this morning on my walk round classes. It is always a pleasure to have our youngest children explain to me how they are using their maths resources to calculate successfully, and a joy to see children using their phonics to write. Just today, I had the pleasure of seeing how early years are using their understanding of pattern to write maths in their workbooks. We have some superstars coming through the school for sure. Mrs Ross, as you may be aware, has responsibility in our school for ensuring talents and high abilities are spotted and nurtured in our open ended teaching and other strategies. We are always keen to hear about talents outside of school too. Please keep sending in photos, emails and messages.

Last week I promised to update you all with our Christmas Action Plan. I am delighted that we will be welcoming THE ARK who are a LIVING NATIVITY provider. We know that without their usual performance, making Christmas special and the story memorable is crucial. We are so excited about this. In addition, we are planning an extra special crafts dinner day. The dinners will be in class bubbles, with the boards showing the roaring fires and carols playing. The children will spend the morning designing and decorating their tables. In the afternoon they will design and make hats for a special competition with prizes. All this kicks off well before though, with advent. We will be having a decoration day in school on Monday 30th, and whilst we cannot have volunteers in, we will still be making this a lot of fun. The teachers will then be here after school putting up the decorations and winter boards for a wow the next day. Following on, we will have a daily class advent with a weekly wreath assembly.

Performances will be slightly different, but we are not going entirely without. We are allowed to make music with bells and ukuleles and we can tell our stories with puppets and technologies. Each key stage is doing something different. This year is the 50th Anniversary of the Children's Society Christingles. We aim to make our Christingle oranges to celebrate, so any donations for providing fruits, please see Mrs Ross.

There will be lots going on in classes individually, so we will take a speed film and collate this for you, being mindful of safeguarding to showcase you the activities rather than faces of children.

We are also connecting with our friends at Oak Manor, to send them greetings from our classes too. In addition, we aim to make ONE GIANT CAKE for a secret gifting—but more on that later. Our PSA have purchased wooden spoons to support us in making a spoonville too! By having the support of the PSA, this means no child misses out, and the decorated spoons will enable us to make a whole school photo to share with you all directly and on our media.

Our partner school in Sri Lanka remains closed at the moment, but our connections in other countries mean that we will compare Christmas around the world. Don't forget that the Eco-Council have found an alternative for cards this year too!

This week, Year 2 had a special assembly from Dave McCallum from the BBC Concert Orchestra. He wowed them with his expert

trumpet playing and the different 'mutes' he uses to make different effects. We saw him play in the BBC Proms on YouTube below and were able to ask him lots of questions. He has been playing trumpet since learning the cornet first at school, 40 years ago. Among other tunes, he shared a bit of his Strictly Come Dancing, as he has been involved in some of the sound recordings for this show too. A clear favourite was Star Wars. If your child would like to take up an instrument, please do raise this with us. There are opportunities to learn an instrument as children go through the school, and Inspiring Music are still able to provide lessons for individuals.

#### Useful websites and tips for reading with your child:

- Follow Up—Build reading comprehension and critical thinking skills by asking follow up questions about he stories you read together. For older children ask them to write a paragraph about the story and explain what they learnt.
- Keep a Book Basket in Every Room—Make books accessible by keeping a basket of age-appropriate books in every room of your home.
- Do a Reading Night—Substitute movie night or game night for reading night and have the whole family sit together in the family room and read. Start with 15 minutes and work your way up as the children get older.

# parent safety measures

## Walk the one way

The one way system prevents the risk of contamination from passers by, and also helps to maintain the social distancing.

## Keep the distance

Covid spreads less easily if people aren't close to each other. We have marked out lines to stay behind, and a safety box at the door to keep clear. Please stay outside of the box when talking to teachers.

# One adult per drop off or collection

With 500 families, keeping numbers down will help to keep you safe, reduce the infection rate and help to keep our school empty. Please do not arrive on site in twos, or threes, or with friends.

# Fewer adults on site at the same time

Our staggered timings reduce the numbers of adults on site at any one time. We know they don't fit everyone, particularly if you have several drop-offs, so please talk to us if you have exceptional challenges. We have classes using different doors, and we also request adults move on after their designated time to help us keep congestion down. We are available by phone or email to answer queries and support you.

## Sanitise and hand wash

Kill the virus in its tracks by using soap or hand sanitiser, and support your child to understand the benefits of hand hygiene

#### Masks

If you enter the reception foyer, you will be in an enclosed space with other users. We advise you wear a mask. In all situations, please do not discard masks on the school grounds. #### **SNAP PCF Annual Survey**

SNAP PCF are running their annual survey to measure parents satisfaction of SEND services across education, health and care in Central Bedfordshire. This survey is important as we need a benchmark of parents current experiences to be able to measure progress over the next 18 months.
