Dear Families and Friends,

We are all here in our casual gear today, wearing our jeans for genes. As part of our learning in PSHCE, which we call 'life learning' with the children, we teach the children about their roles as active members of their communities. We hold cake sales for various charities and cover aspects of community in assemblies. Learning why we raise monies for those less fortunate and how this helps them also ties in with our values learning and the two most important rules we have in school – Be kind. Be helpful.

We are still enjoying the results of last week's scoping audit here at Shefford Lower School. Our fabulous results at the end of year 4 show clearly how well children achieve during their learning journey with us, and we have a clear focus on further improvements. Our results for children achieving across the subjects were very good, and we had an astonishing number of children leaving our school with greater depth grades.

The school was especially praised for the enthusiasm of the teachers as subject leaders and SLT, in terms of driving forwards improvements with big ideas. It is our aim to work for the outstanding grades for our school and offer you the best provisions possible.

This year, our school development plan focuses even more on our writing opportunities, and with reading especially, as this is known to support writing and every other subject too. We are aiming to make better progress with maths reasoning skills too. Reading also supports reasoning. With this in mind, you will have noticed our drive to support reading through our rewards daily, our book sprites and now our new book share. Please join in if you see a book to share or hide.

I was thrilled this week to know that we are having an impact with this already. A parent took the trouble to email me and tell me about the new enthusiasm both their children had towards reading every night. We don't need to tell parents the importance of a daily read, and how a daily read has been shown to develop neurons most successfully for learning – little and often is our message. No matter how old children get, this approach has been shown to be of continued benefit beyond the teenage years, so it is little wonder we are encouraging all of our children to read every night.

This year, the local authority produced graphs for Shefford Lower School attendance, and not just a generic one for the local authority. This graph shows very clearly that the highest outcomes are attributed to the highest attendance in all areas. This must therefore be a significant aspect of our school development plan for all pupils. We follow the advice and templates from our inclusion and attendance officer when responding to absences, and we do not authorise holidays. There are exceptional circumstances where this might be changed.

This week we launched our golden mile activity. The teachers are taking children outside to run their mile during the afternoons, but we are also using our wonderful new house captains to develop this further at breaks and even at the beginning of the school day. We hope to see many of our children gaining their house points for running their miles.





Please see the list below of exceptional circumstances in which a holiday may be authorised. Just a reminder the school office will need proof of all medical appointments for absences to be marked as 'Medical' otherwise these will be marked as 'Unauthorised'.



Exceptional circumstances that may be agreed to are:

A dying close relative in a different country.

A family funeral of a close relative in another country/ part of the country.

Holidays for fostering or adoption purposes.

Religious observance.

Holidays for armed services personnel when meeting the criteria set out by the ministry of defence.

When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis

Where disability means it is difficult for the family to organise care at another time.

Exceptional circumstances do not include:

Being unable to take a family holiday during the 6 week summer break The availability of cheap holidays Poor weather experienced during school holiday periods Overlap with the beginning or end of a term. Different holiday dates for siblings in different schools. A surprise booked by another person/ treat for the child A mistake in term dates when booking
