Dear Friends and Family,

Thank you for your support with wearing face coverings on our site. We are trying very hard to keep numbers as low as we can. We have seen a considerable rise in covid confirmed cases, and we are following the advise for classes which breach thresholds. This includes ventilation, social distancing and increased hygiene. Additionally we are retaining our bubbles, although this is not included in the current advice from the government.

We will be seeking your view shortly regarding parents consultations. Last term we offered a mixture of virtual, telephone and face to face. This was with one parent per child, with face covering. With a more highly transmissible variant working through our school community we are considering whether face to face meetings are the most sensible option. Please help us with this decision by answering the parentmail poll when it arrives.

This week we have had a look at snacks that come into school. Children in Early Years, and in KS1 are offered a free piece of fruit or veg for their snack from the government. Snacks brought in should follow the same principles—fresh fruit or veg. This is not only healthy, but it also minimises litter on our site. Water should be in water bottles to ensure that teeth are not impacted by a steady flow of sugar if sipping juice from a bottle throughout the day. Water is also the healthiest drink and excellent for supporting learning. Our uniform policy is included with today's newsletter. Please note that children are not permitted to wear nail varnish, jewellery and accessories in school and footwear should be black, well fitting shoes. We can offer financial support to eligible families and urge those in need to come forward. All matters are confidential. As part of safeguarding, we do not allow the merchandising of children with games logos that are not age appropriate and may normalise activities that can lead to harm. Please do not send children to 'Forest School' or to lunch, with logo clothes or equipment.

Every morning I do love greeting the children and setting the tone for a cheerful day. It is so wonderful to get a cheery 'good morning' in return. I also like to give out our housepoints when I see our rules being followed, such as dismounting cycles & scooters from the path, or being super helpful. Thank you for encouraging this with the children too.

After I am out on the gate, I make a tour of the classrooms, and do this later in the day too. I come to know the chidren and what they are working on. It is an absolute pleasure to see children settling so fast in the mornings. All of our classes start their learning with a 'morning challenge' routine which contributes to the curriculum, and all classes also ensure a wellbeing check in. We encourage families to check in with us if you have any concerns. It is always our aim to work in partnership with you to support the children and ensure they feel safe and secure. All classes have a photo on the door of people who can help, so children know who they can go to for support.

I have noticed some wonderful reading coming into school and children keen to show me the book they are currently 'into'. Children also benefit from seeing adults read at home, and talking about books. In

school teachers share their own reading habits and we make time for DEAR—Drop Everything And Read. Our Amazon wish list remains active, and you can also find ideas for reading by viewing our curriculum documents for your child's year group. #### Arriving to school on time

When pupils arrive late, they miss out on essential instructions given at the beginning of the lesson.

This can significantly reduce achievement, regardless of academic ability. Your child may also feel awkward arriving to the classroom when everyone else is settled. Furthermore, when one pupil arrives late, it disrupts the entire class and the teacher—everyone's education is compromised.

5 minutes late a day = 3 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

10 minutes late a day = 6.5 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

15 minutes late a day = 10 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

20 minutes late a day = 13 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

30 minutes late a day = 19 DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST A YEAR

#### **Reading at Home Support**

Please find a list of questions you could use to support your child when sharing a book at home. These questions will prompt conversation around the text that has been read.

#### **Author Technique Questions**

Can your child tell you the overall effect the author has created for the reader from their writing?

#### Questions you could ask your child:

I wonder why the author has decided to describe the character like that. What do you think?

Why do you think the author chose this setting and described it in this way? What makes this a good story? Why do you think that?

How does this story make you feel? / What is the author trying to tell you about ...? Why do you think the author has written that sentence in that way? What effect do you think he is trying to have on the reader?

What does the description of this character tell us about how the character is feeling? I wonder why the author described the character like that, what do you think?

#### Layout and Organization Questions

Can your child explain why the text has been set out in a certain way? E.g. why has the author used numbers in a set of instructions?

#### Questions you could ask your child:

What kind of text is this (fiction, non-fiction, information, narrative) How do you know? What is the main event in this story?

What would you expect to find in a text like this? / Why has this picture been used here? Why have these words been made to stand out? / Why are these words in italics? Why are some parts of the text in boxes? What are the sub headings for?

What do the arrows tell you?

#### Retrieval Questions:

The answers are right there in what has been read, they just have to be found.

#### Questions you could ask your child:

Where did the story / event take place?

When did the story take place?

What did he/she/ it look like? / Who are the key characters in the story?

What happened first in the story, how did it end?

Read the part of the story that tells me about ...?

Can you find the part when ...?

How old is it?

Where did he go to school?

#### Inference and Deduction Questions

The answer is not given, it has to be worked out based on what your child HAS read.

For example: If your child reads "the boy dragged his feet and slumped his shoulders on the way home" can your child deduce that the character is feeling sad?

#### Questions you could ask your child:

What words tell you that he is ...?

How do you feel about what happens? Why?

What sort of person do you think that character is after reading his description?

Predict what you think is going to happen. Why do you think that?

Did one of the characters change the story line? How? Why do you think that?

#### **Uniform**

Parents are asked to send their children to school clean, tidy and appropriately dressed. The school uniform comprises of:

**Boys:** Grey trousers or shorts, white polo-shirt and red jumper or sweatshirt. Black school shoes (not trainers); plain black, white or grey socks.

Girls: Grey skirt/pinafore dress or trousers, white polo-shirt, red jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan. Girls may wear plain black shorts under a skirt or dress. Black school shoes (not trainers); plain black, white or grey socks or tights.

Red and white checked dresses may be worn in the summer months – with black modesty shorts.

**PE:** Boys and girls wear black shorts and house t-shirts for PE with black plimsolls. Jogging bottoms, sweatshirts and trainers will be needed for outdoor activities.

Year 4 girls and boys need black football socks and shin pads for PE.

#### House colours:

Your child will be allocated a house group by the school office upon admission. Each house is designated a colour, which your child will wear for PE and sporting events.

Earth House - Green Air House - White Fire House - Red Water House - Blue

Black, white or coloured trainers are only allowed for outdoor PE and are not acceptable for daily school wear.

PE kit must be kept in a <u>named draw-string bag and in school at all times</u>. Other bags are not allowed due to limited cloakroom space.

Ruck sacks in particular do not allow coats to be pegged over the top, and these then fall off and become a safety hazard.

Sweatshirts, cardigans, book bags, PE bags and summer hats displaying the school logo are available to purchase online. Some stock, including recycled uniform is available from the school office.


