Dear Families and Friends,

It is wonderful that spring is here, and we are seeing warmer weather. Being able to use our field space is always a real boon to playtimes. We are seeing uniform changes and items being brought into school. Please remember to be sun safe and ensure feet are safe with closed toe shoes too. Year 4 had the pleasure of a very special visitor in school this week, and it really helped to bring their WWII learning to life. Beryl (AKA Nanny B) actually celebrates her 88<sup>th</sup> birthday today and was 8 years old when her house was bombed. She spoke to the children about being in the Anderson shelter at the time with her family when her dad went back into the house to listen to the 9pm news on the wireless. The house was bombed when he was inside and he was thrown across the room by the blast. Her dad did survive but spent 6 months recovering from a broken leg. Beryl was dug out of the Anderson shelter by wardens and sent to the neighbour's Anderson shelter to stay. Beryl also spoke about rationing at the time and her family were given 50grams of sweets to last a month. If she was chosen at school for being good, she would receive half a pound of butter - her mum was thrilled when she brought it home. Mrs Carter did wonder how Hazel Class would feel if this were their reward!



This week, our whole school e-visited Hillwood school in Sri Lanka. For those of you who are new to our school, this is our twinned school across the globe. The children prepared questions in advance and shared their answers using TEAMs. This was arranged as part of a special assembly with the children there staying later to help manage the time differences. We were able to show them how we have learned our values in different languages and learned from them about the weather and seasons. Our values focus for one more week is still 'Courage & Determination'. We have since received special cards which we will be sharing in Monday's Celebration assembly.

Our SIA (School Improvement Partner) visited us on Tuesday too. As part of the Local Authority, he is tasked to analyse the school performance and we have been pleased to share the results in school and the progress measures. We continue to have a focus area on attendance and of course on reading. Both have seen continued improvements and are life changing areas of a child's school journey which we are very proud of here. We were also able to showcase the developments with music this year too. Going forwards, we have the live assemblies in the hall and can't wait to showcase the choir and instrumentalists.

In exciting news, Miss Leary is soon to be married. I am sure you will all join me in celebrating the soon to be Mrs Farnan and help us to remember her name change!

As summer approaches, head teachers receive increasing requests for holidays and exceptional leave. Our policy provides the criteria which is given by the DfE. The exceptional leave guidance is incredibly strict and rarely applies. Please do ensure you have viewed this (attached to parentmail) before requesting leave outside of the school's 13 week holiday periods. May, in particular, is a month where the school ensure pupils are present for SATs and this has been reinstated this year, along with other statutory assessments from the government in June such as the Year One Phonics, and the Year Four Multiplication Test. In school, we make these tests as low key as possible, whilst ensuring the children are practised too. It is always our aim to remove any stress barriers, and help the children to showcase their best understanding.

Next week, we see year 4 take to the residential again. This has not been possible in previous years, and we know that our pupils grow so much by being part of this. We can't wait to see how much fun they will have.


Myth - Bedtimes are upto me


