Dear Families & Friends

This has been an interesting, yet short term. We have thoroughly enjoyed having our school family back together, and seeing the children settle back into their classes.

As we move into Easter, we have been learning about the Easter story, and thinking about who Jesus was, and the impact he had as a leader. At Shefford, everyone is a leader, with or without a title.

We all lead ourselves and our values, which as you all know is crucial to our daily successes and the happiness of our community here at school.

Mrs Anderson has collated the children's Values work from the last term, and has replenished our 'Rainbow' book, to share in our values assembly, and keep in our hall. Thank you for your contributions.

In school, leaders have been meeting with each other and members of Central Bedfordshire Local Authority to discuss the roadmap towards developing our school as a primary school in 2023. There is currently no new news. We have previously held meetings, and your consultation was presented back to the council last year. Our Governors have this in mind, and we have been budgeting to improve resources in recent meetings. Our Board of Governors do vital work

in our school and if you have key skills to add value to this board, please do enquire after the vacant posts via the school office.

Currently, there is a consultation for the future provision of children with special educational needs and disabilities, available on the CBC website. Please have your say.



Next week, is World Autism Awareness Week. The National Autistic Society have an online quiz; you can try to see how aware you are.

When we return after Easter, we are not altering our stagger times or safety measures. It is still early days. However, we will be reviewing this with the leadership team at Robert Bloomfield in due course. You have been sharing your views with us over time, and we urge you to continue to do so. This assists us in our decisions. For now, I remind you to send one adult per child, to move quickly through the site without waiting, to observe the one way system, to wear face coverings and observe a high level of hand hygiene.

We will continue to operate our routine of lateral flow testing over Easter, to respond to the incubation period of Covid -19. We also request you test our Covid line on 07541 170024 if you have a positive case over Easter. This will be checked for ten days. Should there be a positive case, a ParentMail will be sent to the relevant class, not naming the individual, to ensure we have complied with the requirement to contact trace.

Our school PSA is a group of parents who support our school directly. They help foster a sense of community and motivation, and they raise important funds to keep the highlights of school life in the fore. If you would like to be involved, please do let them know. They are a very friendly crowd and welcome new members.

Mr Tilbury has a club operating in the first week of the holidays for each year group. If you did not get a place, but need child care, Dawn2Dusk are operating throughout the Easter break. Please enquire for places.

Reading is one of the main ways that children build their vocabulary. It is widely known that this supports critical thinking and social thinking, as well as all other subject areas. We will ensure your child has reading books sent home, and we will continue to send home digital logins to support access to reading. Children who read for pleasure are more likely to succeed in many aspects of life, including mental health, according to recent research. It is therefore vital that children learn to read well. We will begin to welcome back some volunteers to our school to listen to readers. If you have some regular time to spare, please do get in touch.

Teachers are preparing for consultation evenings, and we look forward to meeting with you. Reflecting on the past year, we note that the conversations with families have enabled us to know you better, and this has been a very good thing. Fostering those collaborative relationships has been crucial to the success we have seen with our children here at Shefford Lower School. Thank you for all that you have done here too. The children have certainly benefited from this partnership.

After Easter, we hope to reintroduce Forest School. We have been doing this in our own small forest area, but the learning opportunities in the larger forest is far better and more impactful for the children. Mr Tilbury is planning optimistically for this, and we will let you know more next term.

We are also thinking ahead to our sporting events. It is highly unlikely that we will have parents on site in groups. So Miss Leary, our PE leader is working with Mr Tilbury to develop a festival of sport for the Summer. We will have lots to share and will be using our TEAMS pages to support your involvement. If you have ideas, please do share them with Miss Leary and Mr Tilbury.

Finally, as Lent comes to an end, we consider the time at Easter that we will have. There is an opportunity to meet in gardens after 29th March, with a few of the same people. We hope you are able to enjoy these easing of restrictions and look forward to seeing our children again in April.

The one way system prevents the risk of contamination from passers by, and also helps to maintain the

social distancing.

With 500 families, keeping numbers down will help to keep you safe, reduce the infection rate and help to keep our school empty. Please do not arrive on site in twos, or threes, or with friends.

Our staggered timings reduce the numbers of adults on site at any one time. We know they don't fit everyone, particularly if you have several drop-offs, so please talk to us if you have exceptional challenges. We have classes using different doors, and we also request adults move on after their designated time to help us keep congestion down. We are available by phone or email to answer queries and support you.
