Weekly Update

Friday 29th November 2019



As I write this, we are readying for our trip to the Christmas Tree Festival. The season of goodwill is upon us and our values of Peace & Understanding come to the fore, as we ramp up the festivities and continue in our busy school.

It will not have escaped your notice that we have had a number of children and staff absent with sickness. Whilst it is incumbent upon a school to drive up attendance, because this has been so starkly linked to pupil outcomes, we do still operate a 48 hour rule. Enteric illnesses spread quickly and are passed on easily, so the NHS advise 48 hours after the last bout of vomiting. This remains our policy.

We were again visited by the traffic warden, and I am thrilled that the safety of our children is being taken seriously. We have delivered road safety sessions with each child now, and we see that you also reinforce road safety when you ensure children use the pavements and zebra crossings. The other aspect we have taught is the visibility of clothing, as some of our older children attend things later in the evenings around town. Thank you for your continued support on this matter and your reporting of dangerous driving and parking to the local authority—it does help us.

This week in school we were visited by a Buddhist monk. Miss Sharma organised a fully packed day for our children in all year groups, and we were delighted about the feedback from these sessions. Our children have good knowledge, and their enquiry skills were also commented on. Asking questions and seeking answers is how children learn best. Our thanks to Miss Sharma.

Children's language skills are paramount for developing enquiry, and of course all reading supports language development, which we continue to drive as an area of importance. Our children have been building their daily house points and increasing their reading too.

Poetry has been a focus this week. We have been developing our Winter descriptions and linking this to poems and art for our winter displays. I'm looking forward to sharing photos of those displays with you next week—watch this space.

Shefford lights are switched on tomorrow, and I look forward to seeing many of you there. Our choir will be performing, and Mrs Rayner has some alumni musicians in attendance too, which is absolutely wonderful.

Please see the list below of exceptional circumstances in which a holiday may be authorised. Just a reminder the school office will need proof of all medical appointments for absences to be marked as 'Medical' otherwise these will be marked as 'Unauthorised'.



Exceptional circumstances that may be agreed to are:

A dying close relative in a different country.

A family funeral of a close relative in another country/ part of the country.

Holidays for fostering or adoption purposes.

Religious observance.

Holidays for armed services personnel when meeting the criteria set out by the ministry of defence.

When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis

Where disability means it is difficult for the family to organise care at another time.

Exceptional circumstances do not include:

Being unable to take a family holiday during the 6 week summer break The availability of cheap holidays Poor weather experienced during school holiday periods Overlap with the beginning or end of a term. Different holiday dates for siblings in different schools. A surprise booked by another person/ treat for the child A mistake in term dates when booking
