Dear Families and Friends,

Our school is filled with lovely winter themed displays, that were launched for the start of Advent. Here we are now on the count down to Christmas. Children are welcome to bring in cards. There will be a post box in each year group, and values ambassadors will empty these for a Monday delivery — this is to ensure that any risk of covid is mitigated over the weekend. Last year we opted for digital cards, and we encourage those still, both from a safety perspective as well as being 'eco-aware'.

We hope to see you all at our 'Carols in the playground' event at the end of term. Meanwhile, we are getting very Christmassy here.

Thank you for your donations to the PSA. Present Day. Whilst this is a fundraiser, they have gone the extra mile to ensure that EVERY child takes part. Your support of their immense efforts is greatly appreciated. In addition to this, the PSA have already been in to school in the evenings to help Santa with his wrapping. I am sure you don't need me to tell you the undertaking of wrapping several hundred presents, and that you will join me in our thanks to the PSA.

Please could you share our current vacancies. We are seeking a site agent to work with Mr Thorogood in the new year. Mr Nittolo has been with us this year, but takes retirement in December. We are very sorry to see him leave, but he will be back for short pieces of work and to support us in the future too. We wish him lots of luck with his new projects!

Last week we mentioned the drop off at Robert Bloomfield. We wrongly stated this was a ten minute zone, but it is only in fact five minutes. Our parents cannot stop here, and to do causes great congestions to buses and other traffic. This compromises the safety of pupils at both schools. Please could parents also be mindful when parking on School Lane and avoid parking across our neighbours drives which are in constant use.

Our music curriculum has shone this term, with lots of opportunities to play instruments, learn composition and to join a club. We encourage music lessons because it is evidently one of the ways pupils expand the repertoire of processing skills in the brain, and supports higher order thinking. If you want your child to have 1-1 music lessons, these are bought through Inspiring Music on their website. A new term is beginning and they offer a range of different instruments.

Reading is always our goal, and pupils loving reading is the ultimate aim. We carry out lots of activities in school revolving around reading, and this week Mrs Dale-Malloy launched the book advent in our school library. Reading is a fundamental skill that supports children to develop language skills and comprehension. This in turn will support them in all of the curriculum areas and into teenage and adult learning. The correlation of good reading in the early years, with later success in exams is evident. Please could you sign your child's record when they read, and we will be sure to encourage them with the housepoints they have earned. We can also respond to you in partnership with areas of strength and development you notice. Thank you.

The DfE have provided schools with clear guidance around the new Omicron variant of Covid. We are wearing face coverings in school and staying in bubbles as far as is possible. People who are clinically vulnerable are not provided with any different guidance at this stage. Pupils are still expected to attend school as normal, unless symptomatic or presenting with a positive test. We are following the CBC directives, that where there is a family member or close contact with a positive test, children and staff should take a PCR before returning to the setting. Please support us in this, and let's keep everyone as safe as possible from needing to isolate. With that in mind, we do still have to report on absenteeism, and children are expected to be in school as much as possible. Head teachers have very strict guidelines before agreeing non-attendance. This is set out in our policy. We are obliged to forward non-attendance in respect of those meeting threshold for fixed penalty notices. We do not like to do this, and always send out automated letters in accordance with our policy, when pupils meet a trigger. Ultimately, our goal is for pupils to match their potential and to be in school to achieve.

Schools for the Future—the move to primary, was recently paused by CBC. We hope to be able to bring you more information on this shortly. To date, there is no further news. We will keep you posted.
