Dear Families and Friends,

What a lovely week!

We were delighted to be able to offer the children a very special Christmas experience with Ark Farm's Living Nativity. Declan the Donkey was a firm favourite and the sheep going the wrong way did make us chuckle.

This coincides with the children learning about the story of the Nativity and what this means for people of Christian faith.

As all schools approach Christmas, the workforce are mindful of ensuring that families aren't faced with isolation that takes them over the special day. This includes families of school staff.

We are obliged to send home children displaying any likely symptoms of coronavirus; should there be a positive case in school, class or year group, bubbles will be sent home. This would be a shame, as we have much fun planned in school which is already happening. Please adhere to the measures we have requested to ensure that everyone is as safe as possible.

For the avoidance of doubt, I relist these below.

- Walk one way and keep the distance to a minimum 2 meters.
- Wear a face mask if you can
- Sanitise and hand wash as soon as possible and frequently throughout the school day
- Do not linger on site drop and go, collect and go.
- Stick to timings as much as possible, so as not to cause build ups.
- Stay outside of the 2meter boxes drawn outside classroom doors
- Use email of phone to communicate with the teaching or office staff
- If you must, in an emergency, use the front desk, you are requested to enter only if wearing a face covering.

In school, we are now preparing our 'alternative Christmas shows' and our Spoonville Whole School Photo. Your child will be allowed to take their spoon home afterwards.

Our giant cake make has changed destination due to restrictions. We are currently in discussion with Lister Hospital to deliver it to the hardworking medical teams keeping everyone safe.

Dropping Items at the School Office

The one way system prevents the risk of contamination from passers by, and also helps to maintain the

social distancing.

Keep the distance

Covid spreads less easily if people aren't close to each other. We have marked out lines to stay behind, and a safety box at the door to keep clear. Please stay outside of the box when talking to teachers.

One adult per drop off or collection

With 500 families, keeping numbers down will help to keep you safe, reduce the infection rate and help to keep our school empty. Please do not arrive on site in twos, or threes, or with friends.

Our staggered timings reduce the numbers of adults on site at any one time. We know they don't fit everyone, particularly if you have several drop-offs, so please talk to us if you have exceptional challenges. We have classes using different doors, and we also request adults move on after their designated time to help us keep congestion down. We are available by phone or email to answer queries and support you.
