Dear Families and Friends,

It has been a lovely week for our children. We started with a celebration of our children who have earnt head teacher awards. It is always good to showcase pupils who believe in themselves and achieve as a result of their efforts, whether this is for behaviour, written work, discussions, values or play. These children stand on our celebration bench in assembly and we clap their achievements. The additional points they achieve are added to the leader boards, and each week we start counting these afresh.

Forest School is a valued part of our curriculum. It relates to healthy lifestyles in both the PSCHE curriculum, PE and Science. Mr Tilbury is action planning the other curriculum links that can be maximised through the team building and social exercises whilst in the forest. We do undertake this in all weathers, and children need waterproof outerwear. Mrs Edwards has secured raincoats for the school, and we are looking at purchasing ponchos too. Recent extreme weather has enabled us to reflect on this further and whilst we advocate for 'all weathers' we will continue to assess in the moment also.

Parents' evening appointments will be released soon. Mrs Metcalfe is currently absent from school, although we currently anticipate her return after next week. Holly Class parents' appointments will still go ahead with myself or Mrs Ross supporting, or substituting as appropriate. A letter regarding cover arrangements has been sent to parents of Holly class children.

We continue to trial the entry arrangements to Willow Classroom. This is busy in the mornings, but the supervision of children inside is certainly enhanced by using the direct door for the classroom. Please continue to feed back to us your experiences.

I would like to thank parents who have raised the issue of street lighting on School Lane to me. I have been in liaison with the local authority through our Board of Governors. We are exploring the matter and agree that safe access to our adjoining roads and car park is the most desirable outcome.

We end the week with a showcase of our house groups. Their leadership teams of Captains, Vice captains and Prefects are attending the opening of the Co-op and as such, represent our school, alongside Mr Wakefield, our Key Stage 2 leader from Hazel Class . They continue to use their teams to organise the activities they have been given ownership of, in order to raise house points and desirable behaviours and values.



Please see the list below of exceptional circumstances in which a holiday may be authorised. Just a reminder the school office will need proof of all medical appointments for absences to be marked as 'Medical' otherwise these will be marked as 'Unauthorised'.



#### Exceptional circumstances that may be agreed to are:

A dying close relative in a different country.

A family funeral of a close relative in another country/ part of the country.

Holidays for fostering or adoption purposes.

Religious observance.

Holidays for armed services personnel when meeting the criteria set out by the ministry of defence.

When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis

Where disability means it is difficult for the family to organise care at another time.

#### **Exceptional circumstances do not include:**

Being unable to take a family holiday during the 6 week summer break

The availability of cheap holidays

Poor weather experienced during school holiday periods

Overlap with the beginning or end of a term.

Different holiday dates for siblings in different schools.

A surprise booked by another person/ treat for the child

A mistake in term dates when booking
