#### **Weekly Update**

#### **Friday 6th November**



Dear Families,

We have had a very interesting week, as November always is in school. Our poppy display went down to Morrison's at the beginning of the week. We then learned about the significance of why the English let off fireworks on November 5th. Today, on the 6th we celebrate Diwali. I am very excited to see the bright cheerfulness in our school. Next week, we have Children in Need and we usually invite the children to wear something 'spotty' with their school uniform, and raise money for this children's charity. More on this later.

We have been having some wonderful ideas coming in for Christmas, and although we have definitively cancelled our performances, we will be delighting our children with much to come....shhhhh!

We know some of you are disappointed that cards aren't being given out from child to child this year, and present day from the PSA has been changed too. The added risk, and the likelihood of closing bubbles or year groups has to be the highest priority. We have found some alternatives, and there is some eco-learning to accompany those alternatives too. However, it is fully our intention to allow card exchanges again next year, and to make present day really fun. We haven't cancelled Santa visiting our school to deliver his quarantined gifts, and our class parties will be more fun than ever.

Covid safety is crucial for our school to stay open, so I take this opportunity to politely remind you to heed the markings on our pavements for 2m distancing. Robert Bloomfield have kindly marked their pathway that runs up to our site too. We also continue to keep the one way system in action, so please be mindful of this, as numbers rise for Covid both nationally and locally. We do not have a statutory obligation for you to wear masks, but it is something we advocate if you are able to do so. The DfE have not changed their rules on school attendance, so parents are legally responsible for ensuring their children arrive to school daily on time, in accordance with the law.

By the time you read this today, we will have had another special visitor in our school. Rosco, you will know from my previous letter, is Mrs Hall's dog. He has been trained to be in school, and has had a thorough risk assessment devised to support his interactions. This week, our governors ratified the policy for our dog 'mascot' and his first visit to Mrs Hudson's office can happen as he begins to become familiar with his surroundings. Please ensure we have the latest allergy information for your child.

On Sunday, I will be taking the school's poppy wreath into town in a special ceremony to commemorate those who have given their lives for our freedoms. This year is slightly different. We have been asked to have just one person from our school do this, and not to invite groups and families. Our children have been invited by the town mayor, Paul Mackin, to join him on Wednesday to raise the flag above the town hall. Mrs Pearson will be taking a group of children chosen from different classes to do this, including this week's winning school captain, vice captain and prefect. We will be able to view this in our classrooms, using the new technologies we have become familiar with over the lockdown period.

In school, staff have had the hand over training from the DfE to use TEAMs with classes. We know you have accessed our remote learning well through parent mail, and we will continue this if pupils need to self isolate for any reason. We will also continue this in any future lockdown. The benefit of TEAMs is that teachers can now catch up with their classes face to face as well as take and offer feedback. We can support learning more easily than through feedback via telephone, and class children would see each other during their shared feedback sessions.



# parent safety measures

## Walk the one way

The one way system prevents the risk of contamination from passers by, and also helps to maintain the social distancing.

### Keep the distance

Covid spreads less easily if people aren't close to each other. We have marked out lines to stay behind, and a safety box at the door to keep clear. Please stay outside of the box when talking to teachers.

## One adult per drop off or collection

With 500 families, keeping numbers down will help to keep you safe, reduce the infection rate and help to keep our school empty. Please do not arrive on site in twos, or threes, or with friends.

## Fewer adults on site at the same time

Our staggered timings reduce the numbers of adults on site at any one time. We know they don't fit everyone, particularly if you have several drop-offs, so please talk to us if you have exceptional challenges. We have classes using different doors, and we also request adults move on after their designated time to help us keep congestion down. We are available by phone or email to answer queries and support you.

## Sanitise and hand wash

Kill the virus in its tracks by using soap or hand sanitiser, and support your child to understand the benefits of hand hygiene

#### Masks

If you enter the reception foyer, you will be in an enclosed space with other users. We advise you wear a mask. In all situations, please do not discard masks on the school grounds.
