

Weekly Update

Friday 6th September 2019



Welcome back to you all.

We were excited to have the pupils return and fill the school with a flurry of activity. am delighted at how well the first day started, and continued.

I always stand outside at the entrance, and your cheery 'Hellos' are easily the best way for any head teacher to start the day, but also to be available for any immediate queries. Please do just stop and chat.

Our school office have been busy with new admissions, and Monday will see the newest children to our school begin their journey with Mrs Freeman and her early years team in Cherry Class. We understand that many will have queries, and we are always approachable by phone, email or visit.

Our children are excited to be in their new house groups and to vote for their captains. We will be listening to their manifestos and learning about democracy as we cast our ballots. We have started our Values Education with the values of 'Unity & Belonging' sharing what it means to be part of a school or class team as well as a house team; how we at Shefford Lower School come together to Believe~Achieve~Succeed – our school motto. We know that you have supported your children in coming to school happily for their first day, and to try their best. Our teachers will greet you at the door and be available to welcome your child; should you need more time to talk to your child's teacher, they will be happy to arrange a suitable time.

You may have noticed some improvements over the break, as Robert Bloomfield have installed a second ramp on the drive. This was in response to our parents raising the need for pushchairs and two way pedestrian traffic. Our thanks to Mr Farmer's team for resolving this ready for the start of term.

Mr Gardiner has been painting areas of the school and it looks fresh and new inside. Our learning environment is important, and we teach our children to respect and care for it too.

Over the break, the amazing *immersive room* was installed. This has been a project paid for by the PSA after considerable fund raising. The room projects interactive screens onto full walls so that the children are immersed into an experience to enhance their learning. Please see the pictures below! There are so many possibilities. The PSA aren't finished there either – this was a two step project, with the portable floor projection to come.

As we start our new school year, we always reflect back on our previous year. We are delighted with our outcomes. It is always our intention as a staff to work towards the best outcomes by the time children leave us, and become "next phase ready". In Early Years, our pupils learning accelerates and the children leave our provision with higher than average results in all 17 areas. The Year 2 SATs show that our pupils achieve better than the data collated from other schools in the local authority. Our Year 4 results show that we exceed the outcomes produced by the local authority for Reading, Writing & Maths, and that we also have a much higher number of pupils reaching the 'exceeding' grades. It is clear that when our pupils leave and go onto their next phase of education, they have a solid foundation and are equipped well for the curriculums that will follow.

For a minority of pupils who have poor attendance, the local authority have produced data for each of the measures they collate. Quite starkly, we see that as the attendance drops, so do the outcomes. We will be doing our best to be an outstanding provision for children, and this includes encouraging excellent attendance and punctuality. We are even celebrating good attendance and punctuality within our house groups.

Next week, we will be having a scoping audit by the local authority. This involves three school improvement professionals visiting and scrutinising every aspect of our school and learning provisions. It's a bit like an inspection. We are excited to have this, as the feedback will inform our goal setting for the year ahead.

As you may already know, Mrs Ross has taken over the reins as SENDco (special education needs disabilities coordinator), from Miss Bambridge. With Mrs Freeman, she is managing Care Guidance & Support for all pupil groups, and is supported by a wider pastoral team which includes Mrs Parry, Mrs Herbert and Mrs Woods. We welcome any support information you can provide regarding your child, so please do drop us a line, by phone or email. You can pop in and make an appointment, or simply attend our coffee morning on 24th September.

Each year we are asked if we have places in our school. Most year groups are full, although we do have a couple of spaces in Year 1 and in Year 2. Please enquire at the office if you would like further details.

We begin again with Finer Diners next week. Our children truly love practising their table manners and earning a space at the special table. Another new initiative we have started is our Shefford Book Sprites – we have hidden a few books around town and linked this to a Facebook page where you can share your findings, and also share if you too decided to be a sprite and hide a book for someone else to find. We will be hiding some more soon. We hope you enjoy reading and re-hiding them.
