WE NEED YOU

We have had a number of parents who have kindly volunteered to walk to Bridge Street with us next week, to see the 'Children In Need Rickshaw Challenge' come through the town. It is clear we are going to need more support. Both Shefford Lower School and Robert Bloomfield are planning whole school outings, and this will be a huge undertaking. Our lovely mayor, and school governor, Paul Mackin, is meeting with school leaders after school today to devise a coordinated approach to travel and spectating for such large numbers. We are very much looking forward to this great community time together. We will wear uniform, but encourage spotty accessories—donations will be collected in class for Children In Need for those wishing to donate.

Next week in school is also Anti-bullying week. This is an opportunity for us to reinforce the school rules 'Kind & Helpful' and ensure that our values of tolerance and friendship are further instilled in our children as they learn and grow. Our teachers are planning lots of related activities, and we are also taking part in 'odd socks' day to raise awareness of diversity and difference.

Thank you for collecting your Aldi stickers. We are continuing to collect them and hope to have enough for a second set of PE equipment. The children enjoy seeing the chart expand as the stickers were put on

Mrs Woods, one of our English leaders, has registered our school for a reading book token scheme running through the Sun newspaper. If you have these tokens, please send them in - we hope to raise enough for £600 worth of books.

Dangerous driving into our premises has been reported. If you were one of the drivers who sped up by our zebra crossing to drive under the parking barrier, then you nearly knocked over a 4 year old. This was witnessed by two of our school governors, and we take this very seriously. It cannot be stated enough that slow driving around schools and safe parking is paramount to the safety of the 504 children who attend Shefford Lower School. We have also reported several drivers parking in restricted areas.

Shefford Lower School has been selected by a charity who produce local calendars with pictures from a local photographer. Our hardworking PSA entered our school and were selected. The calendars will be on sale at the winter fayre and in our school office.

Please see the list below of exceptional circumstances in which a holiday may be authorised. Just a reminder the school office will need proof of all medical appointments for absences to be marked as 'Medical' otherwise these will be marked as 'Unauthorised'.



#### Exceptional circumstances that may be agreed to are:

A dying close relative in a different country.

A family funeral of a close relative in another country/ part of the country.

Holidays for fostering or adoption purposes.

Religious observance.

Holidays for armed services personnel when meeting the criteria set out by the ministry of defence.

When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis

Where disability means it is difficult for the family to organise care at another time.

#### Exceptional circumstances do not include:

Being unable to take a family holiday during the 6 week summer break The availability of cheap holidays Poor weather experienced during school holiday periods Overlap with the beginning or end of a term. Different holiday dates for siblings in different schools. A surprise booked by another person/ treat for the child A mistake in term dates when booking
