Dear Families and Friends,

To that end, we embrace the fact that pupils will be up a bit later to see how the team fares on Sunday. We will keep our gates open half hour longer on Monday morning, and our registers. Fingers crossed for a win!

This week we have had our 'Countries Day' where staff and pupils dressed up and learned about different countries they had selected. We had some very interesting costumes and items. 


