#### Dear Families and Friends,

How delightful to have had the opportunity to watch year 3 play their P-Bones this week! They have been working hard at learning this tricky instrument, and of course we will be celebrating this in our music vote in assembly on Monday. For those of you that don't know, our children have several opportunities to vote about their learning,; not just to learn about democracy. Each week they vote for the music that is taught in the next week's assemblies, such as Melba Liston that you see here. Mrs Lawson and Miss Mansell take the children through such a range of genres, ages and always teach technical vocabulary to help the children articulate conceptual musical thinking.



We do a similar thing with art each week, with a token system to vote for a piece in our wonderful gallery. Our curators have also started selecting museum pieces to share with the whole school. This is all part of our FLOURISH approach, because we believe that a broad and enhanced curriculum offer enables the children to make connections as well as makes their learning more interesting. Yes we teach the academics, and yes we ensure a high outcome in those, but the richer the content, the better that aspect of learning is too. This is why our continually growing drama focus for writing is also important, and our wow events, which the PSA fundraise for and support. Tonight, we have the family fun event, and I want to thank you all for supporting this, and ultimately supporting the fun aspects of our children's learning journeys.

Year one had their zoo trip this week too and followed this by linking the activities of their animals with their English work on verbs and adjectives. The behaviour of the children during this trip was no less than expected, and as such, the feedback was superb.

We were reminded recently that children bring in sporting achievements to school which are celebrated in assembly, but that the arts aren't given so much of a focus. We do encourage these celebrations in school. Miss Mansell holds music assemblies on Thursdays, and is always thrilled to share any celebrations as it undoubtedly encourages others to take up music too. Our art vote and values assemblies happen on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. We share celebrations in those too. This week, Lily C has brought in the four badges she earned for Thinking Day, Queens Remembrance, Innovate and the Emergency Services. Please don't be shy to share your child's achievements in school, we believe this helps our children to thrive.

Please ensure your child has appropriate kit in for PE. A recent check this week saw children without kits, or no trainers. The summer term brings lots of outside sports, so the appropriate kit is essential. We will send home kits for the break to ensure they are properly named ready for the events we have planned in summer.

The book fair is on today. All part of 'reading for pleasure' and every child had a token to bring home their £1 book, as well as a browsing day to consider other choice reads.

You may have read on our social media that we have been strongly recommended for graduation from the behaviour hub. This has been no small undertaking, and we intend to invest the funding we receive back into the work that has begun to continue to grow the zones and play leader activities, and maintain training.

This is to be updated in our RSE policy (Relationships Sex Education) I am enclosing our policy with this newsletter, and welcome your responses to this. Our policy was consulted on in 2020 with our parent focus group. This focus group has gradually become smaller and smaller, and we would like to encourage new volunteers to this group. The focus group has supported us with policy changes and project planning, with a particular view of when we move to change the age range towards primary. In our last meeting, we reviewed the anti-bullying policy and the policy for school uniform. Mrs Hudson will soon send out a parentmail to request responses. Your views and responses are always needed, as this helps us to get things as right as we possibly can.


