Message from the Head Teacher

We have had an exceptionally busy half term and are all thoroughly enjoying the glimpses of sunshine as we move towards the Summer Term!

Year three have greatly enjoyed their weekly swimming sessions and are growing in confidence in the water. Our Year 4s were a credit to the school on their PGL residential and thoroughly enjoyed the outdoor activities on offer. Our Year 1 children had a lovely day out at Woburn Safari Park. We had a successful Reading for Pleasure Week in school which included the children coming into a 'Reading Cafe' throughout the school where they chatted and looked at books together. Our 'Ready Steady Read' competition also raised £357.30 to go towards books for the school. We thoroughly enjoyed seeing children across the school in costume for our World Book Day celebrations and the children enjoyed choosing books at the book fair. The children have also produced some work, which will go in our foyer, based on the visiting theatre production of The Jungle Book. They also enjoyed a puppet show and year 4 had a workshop which supported them to create their own puppet shows based on the Easter Story. Our PSA have raised lots of money for the school this half term with the introduction of Wonka Bars and a very successful Family Games Night which raised £1101.28 for the school. Projects being worked on at the moment include the development of a sand pit for the children to enjoy at play times and the development of further exhibits for the museum. We have had a successful Parent Forum on the way in which we can work with parents to support children's learning through workshops and developing digital resources. This will inform future school improvement work in this area. As a school, we have been leading a number of local networks to develop teaching practices across the area. These include a Maths network, a Music network and a network of over 30 schools which supports teachers to use engaging strategies in the classroom.

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO



Cherry Class



In our adventures in Cherry Class this half term, we loved learning the story of the Little Red Hen and this story inspired us to bake bread together. We took part in 'Beep Beep Day' and practised crossing the road safely. We have also been exploring the seasonal changes outside and learning about what plants need to grow. We also took part in a fun ballet session.

Next half term, we will be exploring some more stories, such as 'The Enormous Turnip', and using our storytelling skills in lots of ways, such as by drawing characters, or telling our own stories through our play. We will be thinking about the area of Shefford and exploring some of our local landmarks. We will continue to develop our skills in alliteration, rhyme and hearing the sounds in words, as well as developing our game playing skills.











Reception



In our adventures in Reception this half term, we explored the stories of 'The Magic Porridge Pot' and 'The Little Red Hen' in Drawing Club, where we continued to develop our drawing, writing and story telling skills. We have been busy making and tasting porridge and pancakes with different toppings and we also learned about why it is important to recycle. In Phonics, we continued to learn more sounds, and how to read and write these within words, and in Maths, we have been developing our knowledge of numbers up to ten.

Next half term, we will be introduced to two new characters 'Noodle' and 'Titch', and their 'Inventures' - they are inventors that go on adventures! We will be exploring their stories through Drawing Club. We will also be learning about different scientific processes, such as melting and freezing. In Maths, we will be exploring how to build numbers beyond 10, and exploring the counting system and in Phonics, we will be revising all the graphemes that we have learned so far and developing our skills when reading and writing them in longer words.





WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO



Year 1

We've had a lovely Spring Term in year one. The children have enjoyed learning about animals and even had the opportunity to visit Woburn Safari Park to see them in their habitat. Along with this, we had an amazing theatre company come in to perform The Jungle Book. The children loved the show and they enjoyed learning information about the animals within the story. We have also enjoyed the food technology unit this term. The children made a healthy fruit salad and decorated a delicious pancake!

Thank you for all your support with reading and phonics this term. As you are aware, next term the children will have their phonics screening test so we really appreciate any extra support you can provide at home. We are focusing on sound buttoning and blending, which the children are becoming experts at! Please allow them to show you at home, when you get a chance. 
















We have had great fun in year 2 this half term! We have been learning all about the events of the Titanic and it's intended journey across the Atlantic Ocean. In maths we have been learning about the properties of 3D and 2D shape, statistics and fractions. We linked our statistics work to our computing. We collected data on our class and produced block diagrams and pictograms. During Reading for Pleasure Week we enjoyed a reading café where the children 'taste tested' different genres of books and gave their reviews.

We were excited to see a real production of The Jungle Book. We were so enthused by this we produced very detailed and gripping setting descriptions which we are so excited will be turned into a book for the office foyer (also look out for this in their writing progress books!) In science we have been learning about different materials. We have put this knowledge into practice and have designed and made a 'safety egg suit' to protect an egg when dropped from a height.

Next term we will be learning all about the seaside. We will be looking at the features of seaside towns as well as ocean conservation. We will also be learning about famous nurses in history.

Year 3



Year 3 have been superstar swimmers this half term. We have been so impressed with the progress they have made in such a short time, as well as how well they have shown their values whilst being out of school. Year 3 have also been having singing lessons with Inspiring Music every Tuesday. The children have absolutely loved learning all the songs and it has been fantastic to see their enthusiasm and enjoyment in this. We have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians and enjoyed locating Egypt on a map and finding out about it's geographical features. In English recently we have been looking at traditional tales. We used our drama skills to re-tell the story of Hansel and Gretel and had a great time discussing whether or not Cinderella should marry Prince Charming, before writing our own ending. We loved watching the performance of The Jungle Book and took inspiration from this to write descriptions of a jungle setting using expanded noun phrases. Year 3 have continued to impress us with their times tables and the extra practise they are doing at home is certainly paying off, thank you for your support with this.



Next term we are looking forward to learning about the Ancient Greeks and we will be finding out about all the different Gods they believed in, as well as how they lived in their daily life. We will be learning how to tell the time in Maths and any extra practice of this you can do would be greatly appreciated! We will be continuing to focus on times tables as well as fractions and shape. In July we will have our singing concert at Shuttleworth, performing all the songs we have learnt this term. Our lessons have now finished but we will be continuing to practise our lyrics in school each week. We are looking forward to designing and making Greek vases out of clay in Art, and learning about animals and their skeletons in Science. We can't believe that the Summer term has come around so quickly!



Year 4





Year 4 have had such a busy half-term. We had the best time at the PGL residential and the children that remained in school had a fabulous experience during their three offtimetable days. Our children were so lucky to have had their residential experience of outdoor education, and they were so well behaved. Our PGL staff, Kenny and George, were very impressed with the children and our staff were so proud of them. We have also enjoyed creating our new corridor displays for Reading for Pleasure Week. These displays were linked to the author Aaron Becker's trilogy Journey, Quest and Return. Year 4 created some fantastic art linked to the books as well as some superb setting descriptions of these imaginary worlds. We were very lucky to watch The Jungle Book performance as well as have an interactive workshop on how to plan, design, stage and run a performance. The children were very inspired and created their own puppet theatres, scripts and puppets for Holy Week in RE. We finished off our Forest School unit with some fire building with Mr Tilbury during the last week of term.



Next half-term, we will be focusing on Geography and diving into our Extreme Earth theme. We will also be focusing on a new project-based learning week linked to 'Our Global Communities' where we will be working with RBA and the language department to run a French Cafe, along with some fantastic Geography and History learning too. The summer term will get busy for year fours, with transition activities for middle school, Bikeability, leaver's activities and our leaver's assembly.

SCHOOL UPDAT




Community


