Please provide a named PE kit for your child's PE lessons. We will use outside space as well as the hall so please provide warmer clothes for colder months.



In Science we will be focusing on: Rocks and soils










Celtic Harmony visit

In Science we will be focusing on: 'Forces & Magnets/ Light'










Ancient Egyptian Day


Summer: Our History and Geography will focus on 'Ancient Greece' and 'Around the world in 80 days'




In Year 3 we focus on regular times table practice.

The children will take part in their times table test in the Summer Term of year 4.

During the times table test, children are asked to complete 25 questions at random. These include up to the 12 times tables and are presented in a randomised way. They may be presented as multiplication questions or division questions. The test is timed, where pupils will be given 6 seconds to give an answer before they are moved onto the next question.

The pass mark is 25/25.

We ask that pupils regularly practice their times table tests at home to support their learning. Your child has a Times Table Rock Stars log-in at the back of their reading records. House points will be given for anyone that completes at home and it is recorded in their Home/school book.





Spellings: Spellings will be given weekly. These will be a mixture of activities to support spellings and phonics to revisit learning in the classroom. Spelling activity sheets should be taken home every Friday and returned following Friday. The children should practise their list of spellings up to three times at home before a close quiz at the end of the week. The words will be based on a particular spelling objective. The score they received and the spellings they got wrong will be shared with parents in home school books to help support with next steps. Common exception words are regularly tested (half termly) and we ask that you practice these with your children on a regular basis.

Reading: We expect the children to read to an adult at home every night, as part of their weekly homework. Children who read each night will receive a House Point the following day and if they read all week they will also receive a Merit (2 House Points). Please hear your child read and also share and discuss the story together. Home school book recording please.

Learning Logs: . Children will receive a table of activities in their Learning Log and will be able to choose different activities to carry out for their Learning Log task. They have the whole half term to complete the activities they choose. Please feel free to present homework in additional ways e.g models, art work. Have fun and be Creative!

Forest School
